Join Us in Prayer and Action, Together, we can break the chains of trafficking.

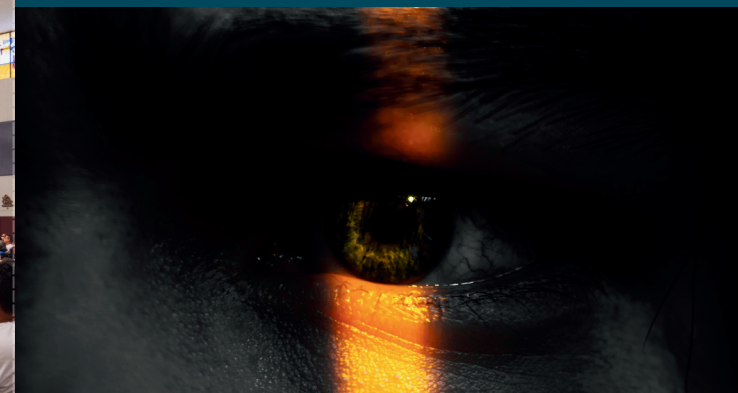

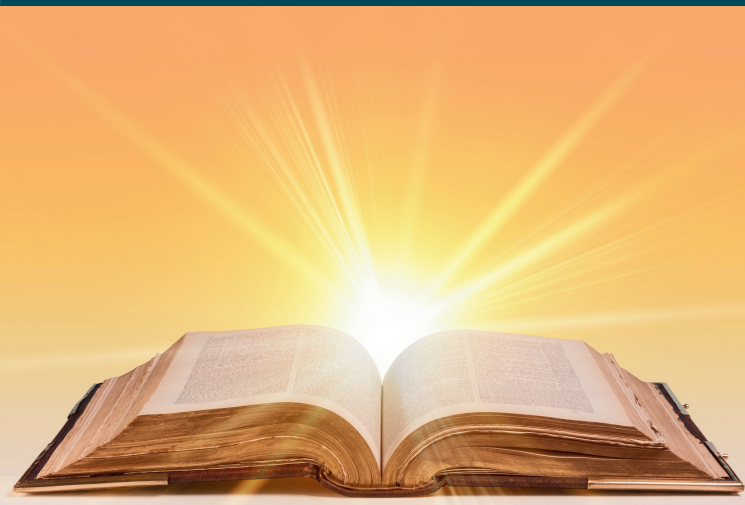


What is Human Trafficking?

- Human trafficking is the modern form of slavery.
- It involves the exploitation of men, women, and children through coercion, deception, or force.
- Victims are often migrants seeking a better life.
- Trafficking denies human dignity and freedom, turning people into commodities.

Did you know?

- Over 50 million people worldwide live in conditions of modern slavery (ILO 2023).
- Migrants and refugees are particularly vulnerable.



The Bible and Human Trafficking

- God created every person in His image and likeness (Genesis 1:27). Exploiting people is a sin against God.
- The Exodus story shows God as the liberator of the oppressed.
- Jesus proclaimed: *"The Spirit of the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor, liberty to captives"* (Luke 4:18).
- St. Paul reminds us: *"For freedom Christ has set us free"* (Galatians 5:1).

The Bible is clear:

Christians are called to protect life, dignity, truth and freedom, rejecting every form of slavery.
